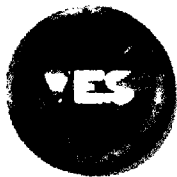

We are so fortunate to have these and other willing volunteers to respond to our inevitable natural disasters and emergencies.

Cindy and Steve are continuously involved with civic activities, such as the Easter breakfast, the Salmon Bake, Tahuya Day, and more. It is Cindy and Steve who built and donated all the beautiful picnic tables for the Tahuya Day Community Club Scholarship raffles. Cindy and Steve volunteered their own time and money at Menard's Landing, repainting the sign, staining the Gazebo, and pulling weeds. She used her gardening talents to enhance the parking area in front of the Fire Department and continues with watering, weeding, painting and cleaning, etc.

Cindy and Steve own their own construction business and build a few new homes in Tahuya and do a lot of repairs, remodels and maintenance for the people who own homes here. Cindy works with Steve on these jobs nearly every day. She has never been afraid of hard work and has the callouses to prove it. Most of their work is repeat for the same people, who are more than pleased with their workmanship and honesty. They are not developers as claimed. They are just two, hardworking, dedicated, generous, community minded people, that have always been an asset to those whose lives they touch.

Cindy served as a County Commissioner for one term.
